Homebuyer education (HBE)

Eligibility for assistance may depend on:

- Type of mortgage
- Property location
- Steady source of income
- Savings for down payment
- Good credit



How VA home loans work

- They have specific eligibility requirements.
- Potential benefits include:
 - Lower interest rates
 - No down payment
 - No mortgage insurance required
- You'll need to pay the appraisal fee and funding fee.
- They can take longer to process than traditional mortgages.

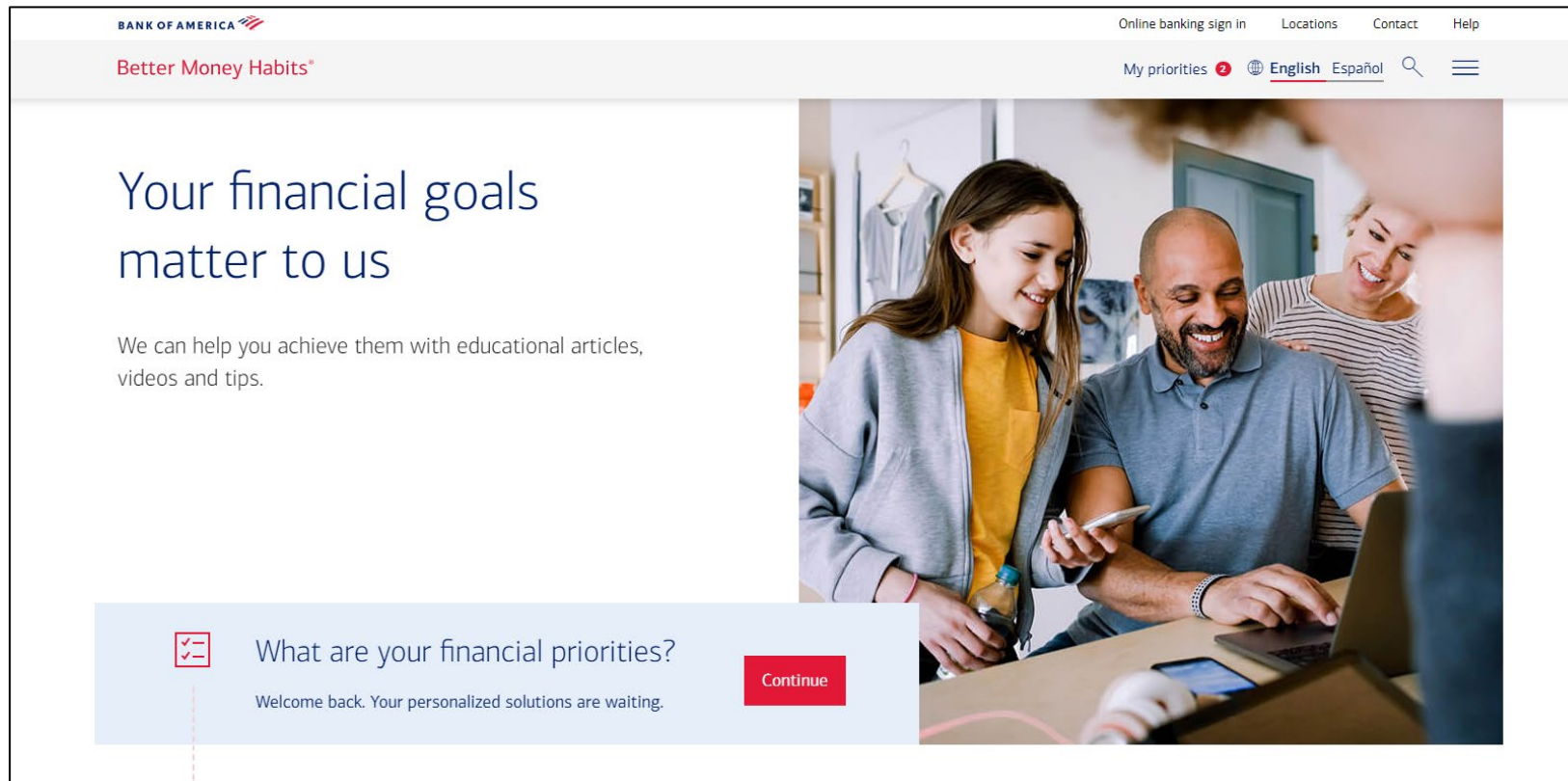
